TITLE: CCTV - ROSSENDALE PRESTON

Executive Summary

Rossendale Borough Council have submitted a request for funding on a cocommissioning basis for the provision of an upgraded CCTV system.

Following increasing crime figures in all the boroughs within Rossendale the PCC attended a public Meeting in Bacup whereby the poor quality of the CCTV in the town was raised as a major concern.

In addressing the problem Rossendale have sought advice from the East Lancs CCTV hub and whilst at this time they cannot join the hub as they are not networked, they have used information already to hand in respect of costings for the support of upgraded camera provision and the areas indicated by the escalating crime figures.

Recommendation

That the Commissioner consider and approve the contribution of £52k to support the improvements to Rossendale CCTV provision.

1. Background and Advice

Crime in Rossendale has risen sharply over the last year or so and in addition people's perception of crime has risen, particularly in Bacup where there have been a number of very visible burglaries in the town centre over the last 12 months. Rossendale has seen the second biggest increase in crime in Lancashire with an overall increase in crime of 20.8% in 2016/17 against 2015/16, with victim based crimes increasing the most. E.g. violence against the person increased by 24.4%. As a result of public concerns, the Police and Crime Commissioner was invited to attend a public meeting in Bacup on 16 February at which the poor quality of the CCTV in the town was raised as a major concern.

Following a review in January 2017 by the 101 Service Task and Finish Group of the Council's Overview and Scrutiny Committee, the Committee agreed the following recommendation be made:

As the Council has an outdated CCTV infrastructure, which are located in these areas (Bacup, Haslingden, Stacksteads & Rawtenstall). The infrastructure and technology is ineffective and on a number of occasions the images provided are not satisfactory for the police to use. Therefore could Cabinet/Council support the need for appropriate investment to upgrade to a more modern system which links into mobile technology. Joint funding could be explored in conjunction with the Police and Crime Commissioner and Lancashire Safety Partnership to provide safer CCTV infrastructure for the Borough. The Council has been quoted £79,040 to overhaul the infrastructure with suitable cameras and technology for remote viewing.

The CCTV Footage in most of the boroughs is of poor quality, static and partially non functional and difficult for the police to access

Attached is a table demonstrating the notable increase in crime figures over the last few years

Having sought advice from Peter Wareing Operations Manager for the new East Lancs CCTV hub he has provided contacts and as a result a survey will be undertaken as part of the funding request to ensure that they have best value for money and use a consistent approach to one that is tried and tested.

Approximate price for the supply and installation of CCTV upgrade to Bacup, Stacksteads Haslingden and Rawtenstall.

The replacement equipment will give the capability of live view, playback and record from a laptop or PC anywhere. Each group of cameras will have a NVR not each pole.

In Bacup, Stacksteads and Haslingden we will supply and install:-

1080P HD Camera

Transmitter /Receiver dish

Pole (for dish)

Switcher.

1080p HD NVR with 4 terabit Hard Drive.

Wire and Sundries.

Labour.

In Rawtenstall we will supply and install:-

1080P HD Cameras

1080P. HD. NVR

Labour.

Each area will require a fibre broadband connection.
