AREA:	Blackburn	PRIORITY:	Developing safe and confident communities
AMOUNT REQUESTED:	£2,200	Match Funds:	Near Neighbours – Bringing People Together Grant
Project Name & Cost	Tied together with a scarf £4,400		
Summary:	Arts 2 Heal will bring together 24 women from different faith backgrounds with the aim to break down barriers between communities through creative workshops. During the four month project the women will have the opportunity to listen to a range of guest speakers whilst designing and creating scarves for the homeless.		
Recommendation:	 That this application is supported by the Commissioner. That a grant of £2,200 is provided to Arts 2 Heal for the Tied together with a scarf project. 		

2. NAME:	Sliding Doors		
AREA:	Blackburn	PRIORITY:	Supporting vulnerable people & Developing safe and confident communities
AMOUNT REQUESTED:	£1,800	Match Funds:	Awards for All grant, Tesco Carriers for Causes and organisations own resources
Project Name & Cost	Youth Club for All £2,520		
Summary:	Sliding Doors will run a youth club for young people with learning difficulties, many of which are vulnerable to crime and isolation. Young people will take part in a range of activities from arts and crafts to cooking and basic skills. Sessions on cybercrime, bullying, grooming and other potential issues will also be delivered to the young people.		
Recommendation:	 That this application is supported by the Commissioner. That a grant of £1,800 is provided to Sliding Doors for the Youth Club for All initiative.

Project Name & Cost	Hate Crime £8,250		
Summary:	The Uniting Communities Organisation will engage young people from a range of backgrounds with the aim to help tackle perceptions and build community links through education, debates and discussions that focus on racial or religiously based motivations or difference.		
Comments:	The Uniting Communities Organisation has liaised with the local policing team who have confirmed they would be happy to engage with the Hate Crime project.		
Recommendation:	That this application is supported by the Commissioner.

Project Name & Cost	Lancashire Communities Together £3,096		
Summary:	Pennine Oaks will work with young people from the Syrian Refugee community along with young people from UK communities over a 10 week period through a range of activities.		
Comments:	The project will work with targeted youngsters through interaction and education with the aim to stop further hate incidents arising.		
Recommendation:	 That this application is supported by the Commissioner. That a grant of £2,500 is provided to Pennine Oaks.

Project Name & Cost	Repairs and refurbishment of safety surface to park playground £2,600		
Details:	Layton Community House / Friends of Kingscote Park would like to refurbish their play park with better facilities which is used by nurseries, schools and youth groups.		
Recommendation:	 That this application is NOT supported by the Commissioner. That it is noted that the organisation has not submitted their constitution or accounts. The project does not fully meet the Commissioner's priorities.
