<b>AMOUNT REQUESTED:</b>	£2,800	<b>Match Funds:</b>	Shops, Help the Homeless and Inspire
<b>Project Name &amp; Cost</b>	#watchUSgrow Community Café £2,800		
<b>Summary:</b>	#watchUSgrow will run a community café on a Friday and Saturday for those recovering from substance misuse, mental health and social isolation. The community café reinforces positive behaviour change and integrates individuals back into the community.		
<b>Comments:</b>	As the previous service provider is unable to continue running the session's #watchUSgrow will take on the community café as part of their weekly timetabled activities and this funding will allow the Community Café to run for a further year. Marks and Spencer's, Greggs and Fare Share provide food supplies and Help the Homeless and Inspire donate each week towards cooking the meals.

<b>Project Name &amp; Cost</b>	Planting the Seed of Friendship £4,020		
<b>Summary:</b>	Arts 2 Heal promotes mental health and well-being through art-based collaborative projects. The planting the seed of friendship 2 month project aims to bring people from various cultural backgrounds together, breakdown social barriers and promote community cohesion. Women will take part in several organised litter picks followed by art workshops where they turn waste into art.		
<b>Comments:</b>	The Arts 2 Heal committee is made up of a members from various backgrounds and members will target women from within their communities.		
<b>Recommendation:</b>	1. That this application is supported by the Commissioner. 2. That a grant of £2,000 is provided to Arts 2 Heal.

<b>Project Name &amp; Cost</b>	Enable New Responders £1,698.92		
<b>Summary:</b>	Chorley Community First Responders work closely with local emergency services in particularly the North West Ambulance Service and Lancashire Constabulary. Volunteers attend incidents where the Police are most likely to be the first on the scene and assist officers by responding to health issues e.g. giving oxygen until the arrival of an emergency ambulance. Chorley Community First Responders (CFR) are a close link with vulnerable members of the community e.g. High Frequency Users. CFR would like to purchase a responder kit to enable another responder to be active in the community.		
<b>Recommendation:</b>	1. That this application is supported by the Commissioner. 2. That a grant of <b>£1,698.92</b> is provided to Chorley Community First Responders <b>conditional</b> upon their constitution.

<b>Summary:</b>	Friends of Hope Street Park will run a 50 week youth club on a Thursday evening specifically targeting youths responsible for anti-social behaviour and at the risk of offending.		
<b>Comments:</b>	Friends of Hope Street Park work closely with their local PCSO who has identified youngsters and asked them what activities they would like to take part in.		
<b>Recommendation:</b>	1. That this application is supported by the Commissioner. 2. That a grant of <b>£3,000</b> is provided to Friends of Hope Street Park <b>conditional</b> they submit their accounts and meet the criteria of the fund. Confirmation of the project will also be sought from the local PCSO.

Young people will split into teams to design and develop a youth provision project. Longridge Community Arts will work with the five successful teams to put projects into real life and apply for further funding with the aim to create a timetable of activities designed by the young people themselves.

The group would like funding towards the overall running costs of the sessions for 10 months.

Sessions will be facilitated by registered counsellors, nurses and psychotherapists on a voluntary basis. Funding would allow The Community Umbrella Project to pilot this initiative for 24 weeks.		
<b>Recommendation:</b>	1. That this application is supported by the Commissioner. 2. That a grant of £1,160 to the Community Umbrella Project conditional they provide their constitution and accounts and meet the criteria of the fund.
