TITLE: SUPPORT FOR YOUNG VICTIMS FUNDING 2015/16

## **Executive Summary**

- 1. The Commissioner has received funding of £1,636,212 from the Ministry of Justice for victims services;
- 2. Victim services have already been commissioned from Victim Support, Victim Voice and Trust House/Birchall Trust. Restorative Justice services, and other projects and initiatives have also been funded to a total value of £968,628.00.
- 3. Providing specialist support services for young people as victims was one of the priorities identified in the Victim Services Review.
- 4. This Decision seeks to confirm the allocation of up to £40,000 from the Victims Grant Funding for the commissioning and initial delivery of a specialist Support for Young Victims for the period January 2016 31 March 2016, and a commitment to provide continuation funding for the period April 2016 March 2017 from future MoJ Victims Grant Funding. Details of the proposals are attached in Appendix B.
- 5. If this Decision is confirmed, there will be a balance of £410,000 remaining in the Victims Grant Fund for allocation against future victim support services.

### Recommendation:

The Commissioner is recommended to approve the proposed use of the Victims Grant Fund as outlined in Appendix B and to note the implications in respect of funding that could be available for future victim support services.
