Project Name & Cost	Lancaster Community Alcohol Partnership £2,000			
Summary:	Emues UK work in partnership with the Police, Council, Schools and many other partners to deliver the CAP (Community Alcohol Partnership) project in Lancaster. As part of the project, Emues would like to deliver self-defence lessons as a diversionary activity to the young people.			
Comments:	As part of the wider project, young people will take part in informal youth sessions to increase awareness of the risks associated with drinking Alcohol.			
Recommendation:	 That this application is supported by the Commissioner. That a grant of £1,000 is provided to Emues UK.

Summary:	Fylde Walking Football Group work with vulnerable adults who have recently been released from custody with the aim to reintegrate and rehabilitate through weekly sport sessions.		
Comments:	Both the Police and the CRC (Community Rehabilitation Company) refer into the sessions.		
Recommendation:	1. That this application is supported by the Commissioner 2. That a grant of £2,500 is provided to Fylde Walking Football Group.

Project Name & Cost	Human Trafficking Outreach Project £1,400		
Details:	Hope for Justice wish to produce multilingual flyers detailing general trafficking indicators and the process to report such crimes to raise awareness of human trafficking. Hope for Justice would also run outreach & awareness raising events.		
Recommendation:	 That this application is NOT supported by the Commissioner. That it is noted that Hope for Justice are not a local community organisation and have more than £10k in unrestricted reserves. 		

B. NAME:	Show Racism the Red Card

Project Name & Cost	The Red Card Hate Crime Project £2,400		
Details:	Show Racism the Red Card wish to run two full day educational events at two Lancashire Football Clubs to young people to discuss racism and hate crime through workshops, guest speakers and a film.		
Recommendation:	That this application is NOT supported by the Commissioner. That it is noted that Show Racism the Red Card have more than £10k in unrestricted reserves and are not a local community group.

Details:	Community Solutions North West has been targeted to vandalism and criminal damage and therefore wish to purchase and install lighting to their building which is used to support and work with vulnerable people.		
Recommendation:	1. That this application is NOT supported by the Commissioner. 2. That it is noted that Community Solutions North West are already receiving funding from one of the Commissioner's other funding streams and are therefore not eligible for CAF Funding. 3. That it is noted that Community Solutions North West have more thank £10k in unrestricted reserves.
