Summary:	Incredible Edible Accrington has been targeted to anti-social behaviour, youth nuisance, vandalism and drug activity and would like to purchase and install gates in order to restrict access to their facilities.		
Comments:	Incredible Edible Accrington provide a range of groups and activities for the community in particularly vulnerable people who suffer from mental health, domestic abuse and substance misuse. The community feel intimated and that it is not safe to visit the site. Incredible Edible Accrington work in partnership with a range of organisations including Hyndburn Borough Council, the local policing team and Community Solutions North West.		
Recommendation:	That this application is supported by the Commissioner. That a grant of £2,600 is provided to Incredible Edible Accrington conditional they submit their constitution and meet the criteria of the fund.

Project Name & Cost	Lancaster & Morecambe Street Aid £3,200		
Summary:	Let's Be Friends would like to purchase and install electronic donation terminals to be placed in the centres of Lancaster and Morecambe. Members of the public will be able to donate money to the homeless safely and securely. Funding donations will be managed by an advisory group made up of public agencies, volunteer groups, charities and those with lived experiences. A trusted representative such as a support worker, police officer, street pastor or charity worker will be able to apply for funding from the advisory group on behalf of the homeless.		
Comments:	Let's Be Friends are working closely with the local policing team to replicate the Street Aid initiative which has been successful in Cambridge and Leicester.		
Recommendation:	 That this application is supported by the Commissioner. That a grant of £1,000 is provided to Let's Be Friends conditional they submit a bank statement and constitution and meet the criteria of the fund. 		

3. NAME:	Moor Nook Youth Development Scheme

Young people will take part in a range of structured sport sessions over the 20 week programme. Moor Nook Youth Development Scheme work closely with the local police and Lancashire County Council Young Peoples Service who will refer vulnerable young people onto the scheme.		
Recommendation:	 That this application is supported by the Commissioner. That a grant of £2,940 is provided to Moor Nook Youth Development Scheme conditional they submit an evaluation from their previous project.

Out in the Bay have also delivered meals and food packages to the most vulnerable people. Out in the Bay would like funding towards the ongoing running costs of the support service.		
Recommendation:	 That this application is NOT supported by the Commissioner. That it is noted that the organisation has applied for £10,000 and therefore do not meet the criteria of the fund. That Out in the Bay have not supplied their latest accounts.
