Executive Summary

The Commissioner allocated £240,000 to the 12 district Community Safety Partnerships for 2020-2021 to address the issues of serious violence.

Each district Community Safety Partnership has up to £20,000 for projects / initiatives that support one or more of the Commissioner's priorities along with one or more of the four Lancashire Violence Reduction Network priority areas.

Due to the pressures the pandemic brought upon CSPs the then Commissioner agreed that any unallocated funding could be rolled forward into 2021-2022 recognising it has not been easy to arrange and plan projects due to Covid-19 restrictions.

This decision seeks to confirm the allocation of £16,500 from the Community Safety Fund to Hyndburn Community Safety Partnership for the initiative outlined in Appendix A.

Recommendation

The Commissioner is recommended to approve the allocation of £16,500 from the Community Safety Partnerships Fund towards the initiative outlined in Appendix A.

Summary:	Hyndburn Community Safety Partnership would like to support their local domestic abuse service HARV to purchase a transit minibus to enable the service to respond quicker and support families to a place of safety. HARV will use the minibus to move families into safe accommodation, move their belongings so they do not have to leave them with the perpetrator, provide transport for service users who have access issues and disabilities, support vulnerable children and young people to attend activities and trips and deliver essential packages to the most vulnerable.		
Recommendation:	The Commissioner is recommended to approve the allocation of £16,500 from the Community Safety Partnership Fund.
