SUMMARY:	<p>Inspire Youth Zone would like to address the Anti-Social Behaviour incidents that have been in the media recently and other associated elements of ASB.</p> <p>They are looking to build on experience to date and launch a new programme specifically targeted at young people engaged in or at risk of engagement in ASB</p> <p>The project will be based around the use of their boxing gym, providing 2 x 2-hour weekly session, with half of the project time going towards these weekly boxing sessions. Additionally, they wish to incorporate age-appropriate content around hard-hitting issues such as knife crime, county lines, and consequences.</p>

SUMMARY:	<p>Funding for the installation of up-to-date CCTV on the Greenhouses site incorporating coverage of the Council compound at the rear of the site, the bowling green adjacent to our site and Stubbylee Lane. The proposed system will include a monitoring base in a secure office and a wireless bridge connecting all the cameras across the site.</p> <p>They also wish to refurbish and repair the existing light columns on their outdoor construction site adjacent to Stubbylee Lane.</p> <p>Throughout they wish to continue working with the neighbourhood police team, Rossendale Borough Council Parks department and communities' team, local community groups and develop a closer working partnership with Bacup Family Centre to offer a safer crime free community.</p> <p>All cameras would be motion sensitive and the system linked to smart phones which would provide staff with instant alerts if activity were sensed at night. Footage can then be instantly monitored, recorded and the police contacted whilst unwanted/ suspicious incidents are taking place. This would give the police teams much better information, evidence and opportunity to detect perpetrators and offer a significant deterrent to others contemplating future crimes or anti-social behaviour in our park.</p>
