Executive Summary <p>This report seeks the approval of the Commissioner to enter into a Memorandum of Understanding on data sharing with HM Prison and Probation Service (HMPPS) to aid the reduction of re-offending.</p>	
Recommendation <p>The Police and Crime Commissioner is recommended to sign and approve the HMPPS Data Sharing Memorandum of Understanding.</p>

1. Background and Advice

Part Two of the PCC Review provided an opportunity for greater Police and Crime Commissioner involvement in offender management and enhance how PCC's and HMPPS work together, given shared priorities on reducing reoffending.

The review raised several Offender Management Recommendations, and this decision specifically relates to the development of a data sharing memorandum of understanding (MoU) to support the reduction of reoffending and provide confidence in local data sharing.

HMPPS have worked closely with the APCC to finalise a MoU on data sharing to aid the reduction of reoffending.

The MoU allows HMPPS to provide PCCs with access to the HMPPS Performance Hub and Segmentation Tool.

This data will cover probation and prison management information and will be a single source of data that can be utilised to inform local reducing reoffending priorities.

The intended benefits are to assist the work of the PCC and HMPPS in developing and delivering the Police and Crime Plan and Regional Reducing Reoffending Plan as well as improve accountability against measures which should lead to better delivery, use of resources, improved effectiveness and efficiency.

The Memorandum of Understanding supports all the priorities in the Police and Crime Plan.

Data sharing will support the reduction of reoffending and further inform local priorities.
