SUMMARY:	<p>They will host 5 Free live theatre performances in community venues of an original drama LADY IN RED across Lancashire – Preston, Burnley, Skelmersdale, Wyre and Chorley. Lady In Red is a lyrical, dynamic piece of theatre that takes the audience on a journey with one woman as she attempts to leave an abusive relationship and the barriers she faces. It helps the audience to finally answer the age old question 'Why doesn't she just leave?' Which remains the main obstacle to many people fully understanding the true nature of domestic violence. All tactics of abuse are covered by the play with a particular focus on coercive control.</p> <p>Each performance will be accompanied by an empowering, educational workshop with the writers & actors to further explore the issues, their personal relevance and how best to seek help, support a friend and recognise abusive behaviour. Accompanied by a display of information, helpline cards, crisis plans etc.. Face to face support from local support services will also be provided enabling an informal and direct opportunity to seek help – a chance to see that support agencies have a 'human face'. They will also film the play and create a version with British Sign Language interpretation - this will widen participation from the deaf community - there will be five free digital screenings accompanied by an after show discussion.</p>
